



Cleaning



- You can just rinse off pollen, sand, and dust with some water (from a hose or watering can).
- For stubborn dirt, use a lint-free cloth or a soft sponge with plenty of water and a light touch.
- To get rid of really tough grime, use warm water and a bit of regular dish soap.



Stuff you should avoid:

- Don't rub your SunForm dry.
- Don't use any abrasive cleaners.
- Glass cleaners, solvents, and alcohol can damage the surface.
- Don't use a pressure washer.

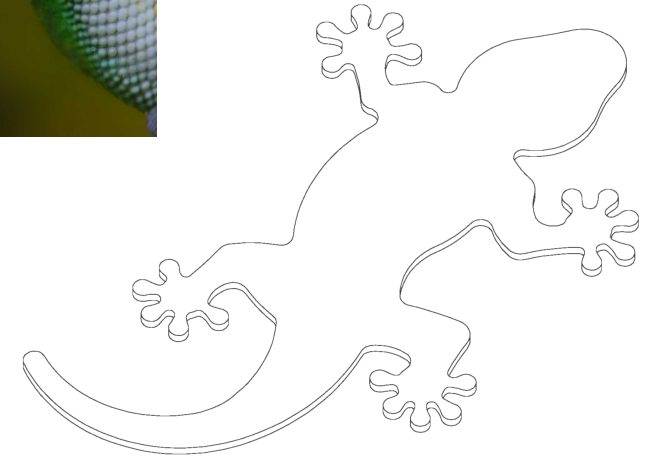
Safety warnings



SunForms aren't toys and aren't suitable for kids under 3.
The mounting kit might contain small parts - **choking hazard**.

If you use brute force (like bending it too much or hitting it hard), the plastic discs might break or splinter. Broken edges can be sharp or pointy and might cause cuts or stabs if you're not careful.

In that case, please wear proper gear (like safety goggles and gloves).

General tips

- SunForms are generally winter-proof and can handle temperatures up to 75 °C.
- The discs come wrapped in protective film. For quality checks or with frosted, engraved, or coated discs (MultiColor), the film is removed during production.
- **To keep the film from tearing on delicate engravings or thin edges, please peel it off nice and slow.**

Assembly Guide

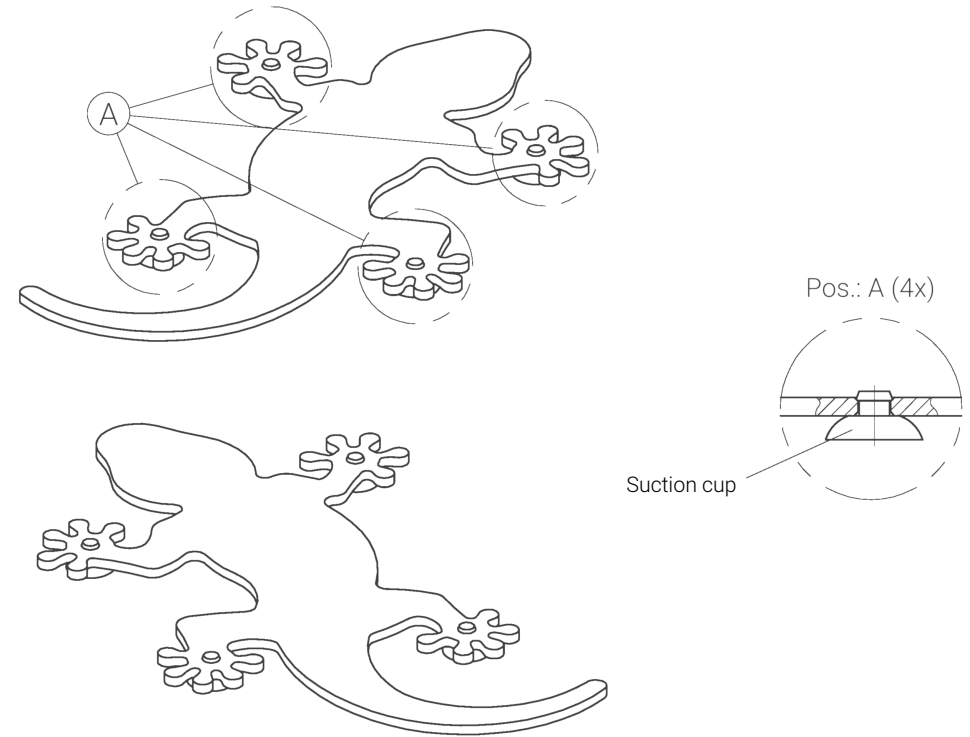
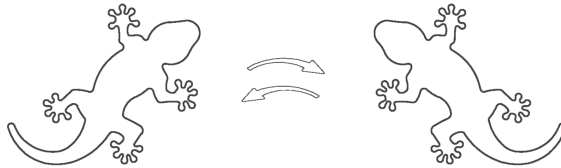
To put this SunForm together, all you'll need is

 a damp cloth (with a little bit of soap).



1.

You can attach the suction cups to either side of the salamander (just check the sketch). Before you start, just decide which side you want to be the top and which should be the bottom.

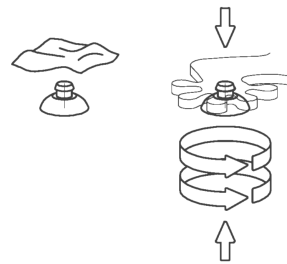


2.

Go ahead and peel off the protective film from both sides.

3.

Wet one of the suction cups and twist it into the hole on one of the feet from the underside. Use a bit of pressure and twist in one direction only—**don't wiggle it back and forth.**



CAREFUL: It might break.

Make sure you're providing support right behind the foot while you're pushing - don't hold it by the leg or the main body.

4.

Now just do the same thing for the rest of the suction cups and feet.

Hanging it up

Your salamander can stick to just about any smooth, airtight surface thanks to its four suction cups—think windows, mirrors, car glass, lacquered furniture, or shiny wall tiles.

A little heads-up

Suction cups don't always stay stuck forever, even on smooth surfaces. If all four let go, your salamander will hit the floor and might break. Every now and then, just give them a quick check and press them back down to make sure they're still holding tight.

Pro tip

If the suction cups ever get old and stiff, just pop them into some boiling water for about a minute to make them soft and flexible again.
