



Cleaning



- You can just rinse off pollen, sand, and dust with some water (from a hose or watering can).
- For stubborn dirt, use a lint-free cloth or a soft sponge with plenty of water and a light touch.
- To get rid of really tough grime, use warm water and a bit of regular dish soap.



Stuff you should avoid:

- Don't rub your SunForm dry.
- Don't use any abrasive cleaners.
- Glass cleaners, solvents, and alcohol can damage the surface.
- Don't use a pressure washer.

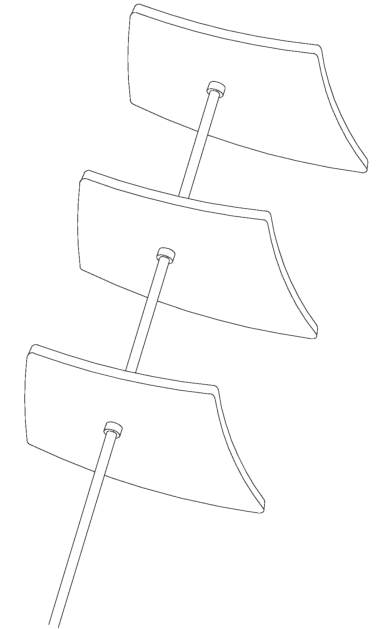
Safety Tips



SunForms aren't toys and aren't suitable for kids under 3.
The mounting kit might contain small parts - **choking hazard**.

If you use brute force (like bending it too much or hitting it hard), the plastic discs might break or splinter. Broken edges can be sharp or pointy and might cause cuts or stabs if you're not careful.

In that case, please wear proper gear (like safety goggles and gloves).

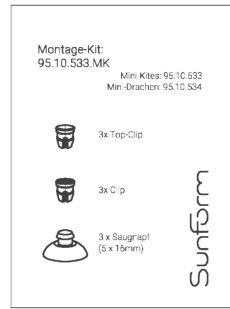
General Info

- SunForms are built for the outdoors—they're completely winterproof and can handle heat up to 75 °C.
- The acrylic discs come with a protective film. Sometimes we remove this at the factory to check the quality, or if the discs are satin-finished, engraved, or coated (MultiColor).
- **Peel with Care: To stop the film from tearing in finely engraved areas or thin sections, please peel it off as slowly as possible.**
- The discs are heated during the bending process, which can sometimes trap air bubbles under the protective film. Don't worry—these disappear when you peel the film off and don't affect the quality at all.

Putting it Together

What you'll need:

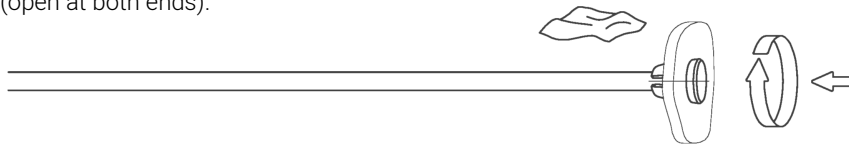
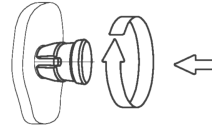
 Just a damp cloth!



Mounting on the rod

Twist the clips into the attachment hole on the kites.

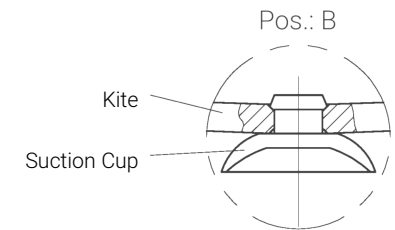
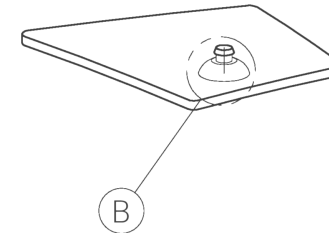
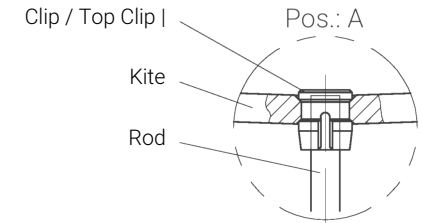
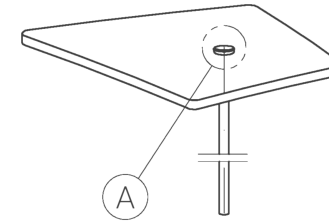
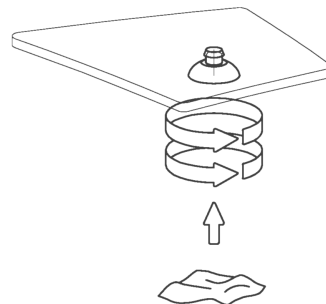
- **Top of the rod:** If you want to mount a kite right at the very top, use the **top clips** (the ones closed at one end).
- **Anywhere else:** Use the **standard clips** (open at both ends).



Dampen the rod first, then slide the kites onto the top or into your preferred spot using a twisting motion.

Mounting with suction cups

Moisten the suction cups and twist them into the kite attachment holes. Use gentle pressure and twist in **one direction only** (don't twist them back and forth).



Setting Up & Mounting

Sun catchers love daylight, but they actually prefer **shadier spots** without harsh, direct sunlight.

- **In the ground:** You can just push the rods straight into the soil. If the ground is firm and it's not too windy, about 3 inches deep is plenty. If the soil is soft or you expect a lot of wind, push them down about 4 to 5 inches.
- **On windows/surfaces:** You can also use the suction cups to stick the kites to any smooth surface.

A Quick Heads-Up!

Suction cups on smooth surfaces don't usually hold forever. Please check how well they're sticking every now and then, and give them a firm press if they start getting loose.

Handy Tip



If your old suction cups have gone stiff and hardened up, just pop them into boiling water for about a minute to make them soft and flexible again!
